EDUCATION

Aico understand the importance of supporting education, realising the pressures that schools and colleges are under financially.

Aico show continued support to schools with student work experience programmes. The programme involves students working alongside colleagues in various departments, to enable them to experience all aspects of a working environment.

Our aim is to encourage students to interact and gain experience by being involved in activities and projects during their placements. Alongside this, we also deliver virtual school engagement sessions.

Our colleagues regularly volunteer to participate in educational sessions such as school careers fairs, apprenticeship events and classroom-based interactive sessions.

We also support local schools by offering students careers advice and guidance, focusing on employability skills and the importance of positive attitude and behaviour.

Two of our colleagues have taken on the role of Enterprise Adviser, working with both Lakelands Academy and

St Martins School. The role of the Enterprise Adviser is to act as a business support for the school, providing critical advice and building relationships with the Careers Lead, resulting in a well-rounded careers programme that every student can access.

As Cornerstone Employers, we show our commitment to supporting young people. Through this opportunity, we work with schools and colleges across Shropshire and beyond to improve careers education, inspire students and ensure all pupils have the support needed to successfully enter the world of work.

We offer students of all ages the opportunity to attend Fire Awareness and Safety Sessions at our Centre of Excellence, as well as in schools. These interactive sessions raise awareness of fire hazards within the home and the dangers of Carbon Monoxide.

Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) workshops are also run at our Centre of Excellence, as well as in multiple schools across Shropshire. Our Product Development Executive is currently undertaking a degree level apprenticeship and has become a STEM Ambassador for Shropshire.

CHARITY

As part of our 'Aico in the Community' programme, we show continued support to many charities, which is driven by a charity focus each year.

SUSTAINABILITY

Our sustainability journey began with a strategy of 'Measure, Reduce, Balance' with the aim of becoming Carbon Neutral by 2030, starting exponential growth towards sustainability from updating our company car policy (hybrid only) to installing more solar panels at our headquarters.

All of our waste is sorted and 96% of our waste produced is either recovered or recycled. We have reduced our plastic waste by over 1000kg.

Aico is an ISO 14001 accredited company; we look to continually reduce our environmental impact year on year.



Here is what we have achieved through some of our projects:

Ei3000MRF Packaging Project – eliminating plastic and reducing paper without compromising product protection saves six tonnes of plastic and eight tonnes of paper per year.

Digital Instructions for the 3000 Series – providing a QR code for the full set of PDF instructions has resulted in a 38-tonne reduction in paper.

eco-fit range - exclusive to the 3000 Series, the eco-fit range does not include easi-fit bases, screwpacks or dustcovers, reducing plastic within the packaging by 100%.

Our headquarters sits on three out of the seven-acre site, leaving the remaining four acres as landscaping. A PV solar garden lines the roof to offset the electricity usage of the building, an attenuation pond and rain water harvesting reduce the amount of surface drainage at the site and over 2,500 square metres of wildflower meadow have been cultivated to support and encourage native pollinators and their ecosystems.

We have signed the Climate Pledge and the Zero Carbon Shropshire Pledge, to demonstrate our

commitment to achieving net zero by 2030, as well as to promote awareness of the urgent need for climate action, solve the challenges of decarbonisation and share practical solutions to deliver a sustainable future.

Centre of Excellence



OUR FACILITIES

We offer our Centre of Excellence facilities at no charge to local organisations and trusts, including councils and local charities, for them to host networking events and business meetings to assist and promote the work that they do.

Local schools and colleges run various educational sessions and Enterprise Programmes within our Centre of Excellence. As well as our Expert Installer training scheme for electrical contractors and apprentices, Aico also offer students of all ages the opportunity to attend Fire Awareness and Safety Sessions at our Centre of Excellence, providing expert training in fire hazard awareness within the home and the dangers of Carbon Monoxide.

Flexible Meeting Room

The Flexible Meeting Room is ideal for meetings and training sessions. Seating up to 40 people comfortably around two tables, the room contains presentation facilities including an interactive smart board and lectern.

Ember Place

Ember Place is a mock bungalow fully furnished and fitted with Aico alarms that was created to help demonstrate alarms and accessories in context within a property. Comprising of a 60's Living Room, 90's Kitchen and futuristic Bedroom, the rooms demonstrate exactly where alarms should be sited and help to educate all visitors on Fire & Carbon Monoxide risks within properties.

Technical Workshop

The newly extended Workshop seats up to 64 people and is a hands on area for training on installation and wiring. This fully equipped space allows visitors to get up close with our products and is also the setting for many Expert Installer training sessions. The Workshop also includes a specially made smoke chamber allowing for live fire demonstrations, providing an innovative way to understand the dangers of fire and how the alarm sensors work to detect the incidents.

Auditorium

The Auditorium is perfect for presentations and conferences, seating 116 people. It is equipped with a 4m projector screen, 4k projector and electric blinds.

Breakout Room

With a bespoke integrated AV system incorporating two 75" TV screens and one 55" TV screen, the Breakout Room is ideal for small meetings, networking and refreshment breaks. The room seats up to 60 people with areas for refreshments including coffee machines.

Mobile Training & Demonstration Units

Bringing our products, technologies and training to you. The latest addition to help support customers are our Mobile Training & Demonstration Units. Designed to enable a complete overview of our products, technologies and knowledge, they travel the length and breadth of the country to give more of our customers a chance to get closer to Aico. Customers can get hands on with the alarms and get to grips with all of the latest technologies through our free, educational training sessions.



FIRE SAFETY SESSIONS

Working closely with schools and colleges within our community is key and we are constantly creating activities that encompass our ethos.

Our colleagues volunteer their time to run on-going Fire Safety Awareness Sessions for students in schools, as well as at our Centre of Excellence training facility in Oswestry.

Aico are always delighted to welcome students and their teachers from Schools and Colleges to our Centre of Excellence, to attend Fire Awareness and Safety sessions.

Our Fire Safety Awareness Sessions are aimed at young people of all ages to provide training to make them aware of fire hazards within the home and the dangers of Carbon Monoxide.

Workshops also include an interactive challenge on Fire and Carbon Monoxide alarm siting.

RESIDENT ENGAGEMENT

Resident engagement is a key part of our efforts within communities as there are often barriers to engaging successfully with residents. It is vital for residents to be aware of the importance of regular testing and maintenance of their Fire & Carbon Monoxide alarms, so we came up with a handy tenant pack comprising of posters, coasters, magnets and pens encouraging residents to test their alarms.

In addition, we have partnered with Inside Housing on the Resident Safety Campaign, an initiative with the aim of increasing the awareness of resident safety and the strategies available to Housing Associations and Landlords, promoting best practice and sharing practical advice on access issues and safety in supported living.

Attending events aimed at residents and families is vital to promoting awareness of Fire & Carbon Monoxide safety within the home, encouraging active involvement and engaging with residents in a friendly and informal manner.

Aico have attended London Borough of Camden's Family Fun Day in partnership with Mulalley Co Ltd, which was aimed at young people for whom English is not their first spoken language and who currently translate key messages for their parents, regarding fire safety. Mulalley's mascot, Safe Sammy, was also in attendance to hand out goody bags to the children.

We also took part in the Lewisham Garden Party for residents of Lewisham Homes, celebrating 100 years of social housing.

There was a great turn out of residents who enjoyed live music, arts and crafts and family theatre. In collaboration with the local police and fire service, our Regional Specification Manager for London South, delivered important and helpful advice to residents on the importance of testing and maintaining their Fire and Carbon Monoxide alarms. With a decorated stall, we educated residents and their children through interactive demonstrations and informative colouring packs, as well as giving away Carbon Monoxide alarms, to further raise awareness of Carbon Monoxide and home fire safety among the residents.
